## PTH 367 Seminar Spiritual Entrepreneurship

This course focuses on the innovative intersection of faith and entrepreneurship. Utilizing FaithLearnThrive's Innovation Lab format, this course immerses students in the principles of spiritual entrepreneurship. Through a blend of theoretical learning and practical application, students will explore how to innovate within ministry settings, develop sustainable projects, and engage communities effectively. The course culminates in a capstone project, allowing students to create a comprehensive plan for a new ministry initiative.

As a distinctive feature of this course, students will have the unprecedented opportunity to apply to participate in the "Start-Up Bus" experience, an innovative component of the Teaching Spiritual Entrepreneurship at Princeton. This immersive journey is designed to bring students' entrepreneurial ideas into sharper focus through real-world engagement and mentorship. Over the course of several days, participants will develop an innovative faith-based business idea as part of a pitch competition. The Start-Up Bus experience will not only deepen students' understanding of the practicalities of launching and sustaining faith-driven ventures but also serve as a catalyst for the implementation of their final capstone projects. \*The course is a prerequisite to applying for the Start-Up Bus J-Term Teaching Spiritual Entrepreneurship Grant Initiative with Princeton University.
