Pre-requisite TSE 110 Systematic Theology I

In this course, we will take a broad perspective on key aspects of parish life for the minister. Questions students in this course shall pursue include: What is a parish, theologically speaking? What informs our theological understandings of the life and work of a parish? How does my theology of parish life and work and my roles in the parish shape the ways I meet God's people in this place? How do I lead? How is pastoral care done? How do I teach? The class will engage in both the theory (theology) and practice of ministry.

Rev. Dr. William Gregg received his PhD in systematic theology from the University of Notre Dame and has served the Episcopal Church as a Priest and Bishop. He has taught at Duke Divinity School, Mitchell College, and Saint Mary-of-the-Woods College.
